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Green your skills! Cross-cutting key competencies for achieving all SDGs

The holder of this badge has attended the course "Green your skills! Cross-cutting key competencies for achieving all SDGs" organized by the University Basilicata as part of the "Competenze trasversali in Unibas" Project.

As societies around the world struggle to keep pace with the progress of technology and globalization, they encounter many new challenges. These include increasing complexity and uncertainty, more individualization and social diversity; expanding economic and cultural uniformity; degradation of the ecosystem services upon which they depend; and greater vulnerability and exposure to natural and technological hazards. All these conditions require creative and self-organized action because the complexity of the situation surpasses basic problem-solving processes that go strictly according to plan. People must learn to understand the complex world in which they live. They need to be able to collaborate, speak up and act for positive change. We can call these people "sustainability citizens", they need to have certain key competencies that allow them to engage constructively and responsibly with today's world.

The sustainability key competencies represent what sustainability citizens particularly need to deal with today's complex challenges. They are relevant to all Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and also enable individuals to relate the different SDGs to each other as well as to see "the big picture" of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

The course provides students with both the skills related to sustainability that will support us in our transition to a sustainable world, and cross-cutting key competencies for achieving all SDGs.

The course is divided in theoretical moments and laboratory activities.



Skills

The owner of this Badge has proved to have the following skills:

- Ability to analyze and evaluate the cause/effect relationship between growth and environmental issues
- Ability to analyze critically the complexity of sustainability
- Ability to define sustainable projects and behaviors

The owner of this Badge has proved to have the following skills:

- Systems thinking competency
- Anticipatory competency
- Normative competency
- Strategic competency
- Collaboration competency
- Critical thinking competency
- Self-awareness competency
- Integrated problem-solving competency

The owner of this Badge has shown to have acquired the following knowledge:

- Agenda 2030 and SDGs
- Causes and effects of poverty such as unequal distribution of resources and power, colonization, conflicts, disasters caused by natural hazards and other climate change-induced impacts, environmental degradation and technological disasters, and the lack of social protection systems and measures
- The important role of culture in achieving sustainability

Criteria

The Badge is awarded upon attendance of the course "Green your skills! Cross-cutting key competencies for achieving all SDGs" provides those skills related to sustainability that will support us in our transition to a sustainable world, as well as cross-cutting key competencies for achieving all SDGs skills for active and sustainable citizenship.

The course includes the study of Agenda 2030, as well as the interaction with the teacher and other students.

At the end of the course, participants must produce "Agenda 2030 for Basilicata", that is a measuring of regional sustainability.

The collection of information resources, the work on Basilicata and the percentage of attendance (which cannot be less than 70% of the entire duration) are the elements upon which the final evaluation and the granting of the Badge is assessed.

The total duration foreseen by the course is 25 hours.



Green your skills! Competenze trasversali per raggiungere gli SDGs



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The University of Basilicata is the leading University of the Basilicata region, in the Southern part of Italy. Since 2012, according to the new University statute and rules of procedure, ex D.R. n. 88/2012, the University of Basilicata is organized through six primary structures (precisely four departments and two schools) in which the functions and the personnel of the pre-existing twelve departments and eight faculties have been re-addressed. Degree programs range from the Humanities, to architecture, archeology, education, economics and management, as well as to the STEM disciplines (hard sciences, agriculture, engineering, computer sciences). Such degree programs are effectively connected to the research, training and third mission activities developed by the primary structures. University of Basilicata counts about 7000 students, and is based in the cities of Potenza and Matera.



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
